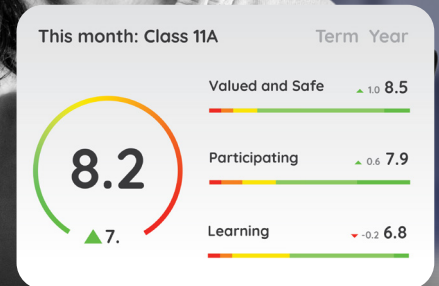

Helping Your School Navigate ERO's New School Improvement Framework

What is changing and when?

The Education Review Office's new School Improvement Framework (SIF) is bringing significant changes to how schools monitor and act on wellbeing.

Starting in Term 2, 2026, schools must monitor wellbeing regularly, act on what they see, and demonstrate progress over time. ERO will assess schools across 14 key areas as part of the new School Improvement Framework.

At the centre of it all is one clear outcome: academic success and wellbeing, not as separate priorities,

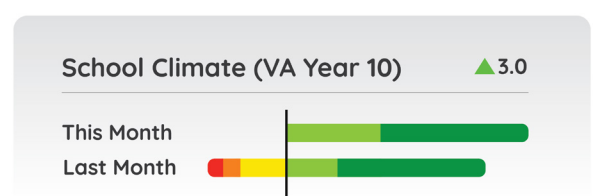
but as something deeply connected to teaching, learning, and the overall school experience.

When it comes to student and staff wellbeing, schools must now be able to demonstrate:

- consistently gathering insights into staff and student wellbeing
- how they have responded to those insights over time
- where/if progress has been made as a result of their responses.

Once-a-year surveys are no longer enough

Many schools already use surveys like NZCER to gather wellbeing data. But a single point in time might no longer be enough to meet the new expectations.
